





# what are the annual profits of forced labour?






# what is the cost to the UK economy?

### Over £4bn







### Possible response / follow up:

- Connect potential victim with first responder to refer into National Referral Mechanism
- Report information to law enforcement
- Provide safety planning
- Signpost to alternative organisations and support
- No immediate action caller to get back in contact if needed or if additional info is obtained
